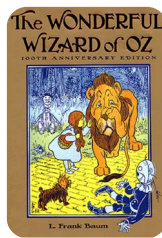

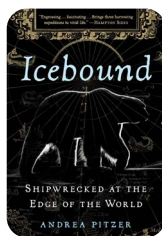
AUTHOR VISITS & BOOK DISCUSSIONS

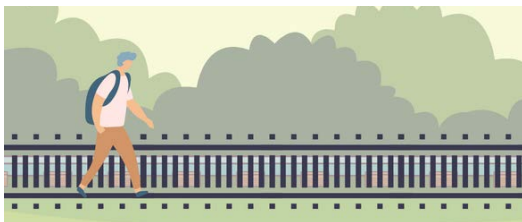


Voorheesville History Walk with Mr. Ulion
