Greetings from the Voorheesville Public Library!

The greatest joy of working in a library is watching someone discover a new book, program, or service we offer for free.

- "You loan snowshoes?"
- "I can read the Times Union and the New York Times online?"
- "You have jewelry making classes?"

We love to surprise our community with all the ways we can enrich people's lives and improve the value of the library. Of course, we still lend books, but did you know we also lend tool sets, metal detectors, and a telescope? Those are just a few of the items available in our Library of Things. E-books and downloadable audiobooks are very popular, but have you used CreativeBug to learn a new craft or Kanopy to stream an Oscar-winning movie? We host children's storytimes and multiple book discussions for people of all ages each month, but have you gone on a local history walk or tried a family yoga class?

We like to think the Voorheesville Public Library (VPL) is the best deal around, and we love to see our patrons get the most value from their library card. Over the last few months, we have asked some of you to participate in our Library Value Calculator challenge (see photos). If you have borrowed any materials since April, you may have noticed your estimated savings on the bottom of your check-out receipt. We hope you are impressed with the results and inspired to make the most of your own membership.

One way we have been able to provide such a range of services while being fiscally responsible is through seeking grants. Over the past year, we have received funding from the Northeast Wellness and Fitness Initiative to host hiking and walking programs and purchase new items, like our snowshoes. The Albany Musicians' Association has partially funded a number of our concerts. In October, Assemblymember Patricia Fahy presented us with a check from the New York State Library Construction Aid fund to help us bring some much-needed improvements to our building. Our new private study room/small meeting room, which was completed this winter, was partially funded by

state aid as well. In the next year, we will be improving and expanding the vestibule at the School Road entrance and creating new quiet reading areas with more natural light. We are also planning improvements to the children's area and service desks, all without having to ask for capital funds from you, our taxpayers.

The next time you visit VPL, whether it is for the first time or five-hundredth time, we look forward to surprising you with something new!
