**Box 1: Book Accession Records (Sample range 1915-1990)**

**Accession Records** The records of the acquisition of books by the VPL are found in the Accession Books of the library. The books have columns of data as follows: accession no., author's name, title of book, place and/or publisher, year of publication, source and cost and remarks (withdrawn, discarded) and other columns that were not used.

**Box 2: Circulation Records, Misc. Documents (Date Range 1936-2000's)****Notes on Circulation Books (F1 & F2):**

These are statistical records of circulation of books from the VPL. The books are entitled: *Circulation Record Book* and are all published by Gaylord Bros., Syracuse, NY. Circulation data was recorded daily and divided into two sections, adult and juvenile. The statistical information compiled is collected by DDC system class numbers. A brief survey of the monthly numbers indicates (what many other studies have also found) that fiction is overwhelmingly the most borrowed material. Each volume also a few pages of Monthly Summaries of numbers of borrowed items by month and class number.

These survey forms were part of the planning for a new library building; see Box 7, F. 2.

A couple of regular entries for receipts are of particular interest. Beginning in 1925 and continuing to 1934 there was receipt of \$200 to a high of \$350 from “local taxation”, with no money received from that source in 1935. In 1936, the VFL began to receive annual “grants” of about \$400-\$450 from the Village of Voorheesville. Were the “local taxation” and “grant” the same item with a different name? The NY State Library began to make an annual grant to the library of \$100 about 1916 and this amount never changes as late as 1943 when the VFL received a state grant of \$100. There is also a 1 p. Annual School Budget for the Voorheesville Central School for 1943-44 included with this file.

The Small Town at the Millenium Festival Weekend (STM) was held in Voorheesville, NY on May 29-30, 1993. The idea for the festival was suggested by Lauren Ayers as a “way to look at what we have in our community and mark its significance as we approach the next century. In particular, the celebration is a way to recognize the goodness of life, the creative spirit and the humanitarian practices in small towns throughout America.” The organizers of the festival included the Voorheesville Public Library, Voorheesville Central School District and many organizations, businesses, churches and individuals in the Village of Voorheesville and Town of New Scotland. Most of the activities of the two-day festival occurred in the Village of Voorheesville. The activities included an art show, bike ride, foot races, Memorial Day parade, music and dancing, food, New Scotland Historical Association driving tour and open house, horseshow tournament, and much else. The organizers also collected items for a time capsule to be opened in 2093. Box also contains VHS and DVD conversion that records some of the planning for the festival, as well as the many events.
